

Procedure for importation of Acrylic Yarn from Nepal to India under Indo—Nepal Treaty of Trade

- ❖ The Nepalese exporter applies for certificate of quota distribution to Ministry of Commerce, Department of Commerce, Govt. of Nepal for export of Acrylic Yarn to India under Indo-Nepal Treaty of Trade (Document – 1).
- ❖ The Nepalese exporter will get a Certificate of Quota for export to India from the Federation of Nepalese Chambers of Commerce & Industry (Document – 2).
- ❖ The Nepalese exporter will submit the Document 1 & 2 to Regional Office of the Textiles Committee, Gurugram, Haryana (erstwhile located at Naraina, New Delhi). Based on the said documents Textiles Committee, Gurugram, Haryana will issue an allocation letter to the concerned Indian Land Custom Station with a copy to Nepalese exporter.(Document – 3)
- ❖ Textiles Committee will issue a Pass Book to Nepalese exporter for tracking the imports - invoice wise. (Document – 4).
- ❖ The Indian Customs authorities will make an endorsement on the Pass Book against each consignment of import (from Nepal) cleared through the Land Customs Station.
- ❖ The quantity of import should not exceed the total tonnage allotted to the Nepalese exporter holding the pass book.
- ❖ In order to maintain the record of imports to India the Nepalese exporters will submit the following documents to the Textiles Committee, Gurugram within seven days from the date of export.
 - (a) copy of Invoice
 - (b) Bill of Entry
 - (c) Photo copy of the pass book endorsed by the Land Customs Stations of India to the Textiles Committee.
- ❖ A period of 30 days will be given to the Nepalese exporter from the date of allotment mentioned in the pass book to export entire allotted quantity of Acrylic yarn to India.
